MINUTES - JANUARY 19, 2005

FAIR LAWN ALLIANCE FOR SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION

At 7:35 PM the meeting was called to order by Sgt. Robert Boyle, President.

The attendance sign in sheet was passed around. Present at the meeting were: Sgt. Robert Boyle, Lorraine Fleming and Cindy Martinez. Stephanie Nauta, Joel Liebman and Carol Wagner arrived while the meeting was in progress.

The December 15, 2004 minutes were presented. An email vote was taken following the meeting to accept the minutes. The motion was passed with seven votes in favor; none opposed.

Chuck Logan was not in attendance to present the Treasurer's Report. L. Fleming reported that \$100 was paid to KidStuff for coupon book sales.

Activity Reports

The Grant Coordinator's Report was provided by Carol Wagner. All County reports have been submitted and the report presented is the final report for the year 2004.

Fundraising: KidStuff Coupon Books - twelve books have been sold. The sale will continue through February. The InkJet Recycling Program continues. Cell phone recycling has begun. The on line magazine subscription fundraiser is in progress.

Old Business

The Alliance welcomed Joel Liebman. He is one of the Fair Lawn High School appointed student representatives. Joel is the President of the Senior Class at FLHS.

The Explorer Program information was presented by Sgt. Boyle. They will be meeting twice monthly and at present there are twenty-one members. The Explorer Program is an extension to the Jr. Police Academy for law enforcement career oriented youths.

Sgt. Boyle advised that the Bike Rodeo is scheduled for April 9, 2005 11AM-2PM. The rain date is April 23, 2005. This activity will be held at the Memorial School Parking Lot and is supported by State Farm Insurance Co., Fair Lawn Police Department, The Explorer Program, and the Fair Lawn Alliance for Substance Abuse Prevention. There will be free bike stamping, and free equipment and bicycle inspection. FLASAP will sponsor helmet sales at \$9 each. Flyers will be printed and distributed to K-8 graders with the approval of Mr. Watson, Supt. Of Schools. 5,000 flyers will be required and the flyer will be reduced from two pages as in prior years to one page. The cost of printing should not exceed \$200. An email vote followed the meeting and was passed with seven votes in favor of supporting the printing costs.

The scholarship fund discussion will be held at the March 16, 2005 meeting. Last year's student representative, Mike Weil, has agreed to participate in this committee via phone and email from George Washington University where he is a student. If this becomes an active committee, he

would like to be involved.

New Business

Councilman Allan Caan has been appointed the 2005 Council Liaison to FLASAP.

Dave Reiter from Jarrand Promotions is the President of the All Sports Association. He contacted FLASAP to obtain a speaker for the March Coach Training Meeting. Det. Sgt. Derek Bastinck has agreed to speak about substance abuse identification at the Coach Training Meeting.

Fair Lawn High School is planning their Valentine's Day substance free dance activity. They have requested financial support from FLASAP. Last year we supported the activity in the amount of \$600. This year the committee is requestesting \$550. An email vote was taken and passed with seven votes in favor to support the activity. Another vote was taken to accept the expenditure.

Stepanie Nauta suggested the schools become involved in the April 13th Kick Butt's Day which is a tobacco free youth activity. Joel Liebman will refer this activity to Matt Markman and Eileen Yeager will be advised of the suggestion.

No February meeting is scheduled. The next meeting is March 16, 2005 at 12:30 PM in Room 201.

The Radburn Street Fair is scheduled for June 5, 2005. The River Road Street Fair is scheduled for October 9, 2005. An email vote was taken following the meeting to determine whether FLASAP will sponsor a table at each of these events and to expend up to \$250 for each of these events for substance free related give away items. This motion was passed with seven votes in favor.

At 8:15 PM the video "Stoned Cold" was shown. A brief discussion followed.

L. Fleming motioned to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by Cindy Martinez. There was no further business to be discussed and the meeting was adjoured at 9:25 PM
