## Recycling Program Changes

- ✓ New curbside collection schedule effective 1/1/16
- ✓ Barrels containing paper/cardboard MUST display a blue decal
- ✓ Barrels containing bottles / cans MUST display a red decal, except if in green Borough barrel.  
Call 201-794-5341 to obtain your decals free of charge
- ✓ Failure to secure paper/cardboard in a container or properly secure will result in non-collection.  
Materials that are windblown are NOT the responsibility of the collection crew to clean up.
  - ✓ Overweight and/or oversized barrels will no longer be collected.

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

# Recycling Curbside Collection Regulations

## Recycling Collection Contractor:


The Borough has contracted with Cali Carting. All recycling complaints, including missed collections, should be directed to Cali Carting directly. Their phone number is 201-991-5400 or e-mail [info@calicarting.com](mailto:info@calicarting.com) (visit their website at [www.calicarting.com](http://www.calicarting.com)). Additional assistance or recycling questions may be provided through the Fair Lawn Recycling Coordinator at 201-794-5341.

The recycling contractor will not collect on the following holidays: New Years Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas. Consult the collection calendar for your section for the next recycling day.



## [P] Paper & Cardboard:

**Yes:** Newspapers, magazines, junk mail, cereal boxes, cardboard boxes, books (hard covers removed), empty pizza boxes, wrapping paper and SHREDDED PAPER  
**No:** styrofoam, wall paper, wood, paper contaminated with body fluids or wax coated paper (milk or juice containers).



**Placement at Curb:** String tie in bundles no higher than 12 inches, paper bags or in cardboard boxes. Cardboard boxes must be broken down for easier handling (string tie or place in another box). Paper and cardboard will **not** be collected if it is placed in a sturdy container or garbage can **unless it displays the blue decal issued by the Recycling Office**. Blue decals are available by calling the Recycling Office at 201-794-5304. The green Borough recycling barrel is prohibited from being used as a container for

cardboard or paper. **NO PLASTIC BAGS!**

**DO NOT PUT LOOSE OR UNSECURED MATERIALS AT THE CURB! ALL PAPER & CARDBOARD MUST BE TIED OR IN A BARREL TO PREVENT FROM BEING WINDBLOWN.**



## [C] Bottles, Cans & Plastic Containers (Commingle):

**Yes:** Glass bottles and jars, aluminum cans, aluminum foil, tin cans, sturdy **plastic** containers and wax coated (gable) containers (milk, juice, etc.)

**No:** Mirrors, light bulbs, ceramics, dishes, frosted glass, leaded crystal, safety glass, mugs, microwaveable glass, food contaminated items, scrap metal, paint cans, toys, styrofoam, plastic bags, saran wrap, or any non-acceptable plastic.

**Placement at Curb:** Bottles & Cans may **only** be placed in the **green Borough recycling barrel** or non-Borough barrels if it displays the **red decal issued by the Recycling Office**. Replacement covers are **not** supplied by the Borough. **NO PLASTIC BAGS!**



## [Y] Yard Waste:

**Yes:** Grass, leaves, brush, branches (less than 3 inches in diameter), wood chips and Christmas trees.

**No:** Logs, stumps, construction material, branches (over 3 inches in diameter), furniture, doors, windows, or any lumber.

**Placement at Curb:** Paper bags or a sturdy container not weighing more than **40 lbs**. Branches must be tied in 3 foot lengths. Christmas trees must be cleaned of all ornaments and tinsel. Yard waste will **not** be collected if placed out in cardboard boxes, plastic bags or the green recycling barrel. No barrels with openings smaller in diameter than the base of the barrel or landscaper barrels. **NO PLASTIC BAGS!**

**The following recyclables are collected BY APPOINTMENT ONLY on your recycling day. Please call 201-794-5341 to schedule your collection.**

## Scrap Metal, Appliances & Electronics:

**Yes:** Refrigerators, stoves, washers, dryers, dishwashers, bed frames, water heaters, ACs, boilers, bicycles, BBQs, or any item that is at least 50% metal content. Electronics include TVs, computers, stereos, VCRs, cell phones and camera equipment.


**No:** Box springs, mattresses, construction material, plastic, porcelain sinks, tubs, toilets, wood furniture or tanks.

**Placement at Curb:** Must not be placed in street and may only be at the curb after 6 pm the night before collection. Residents are asked to put the item out in the morning before 6:00 AM. Hot water heaters must have green inspection sticker (with purchase of permit) prior to collection. Refrigerators and freezers must have the doors removed per State Law. Appointments are scheduled for your next available recycling day.

## SPECIAL NOTE:

**Borough Recycling Barrel:** The green Borough recycling barrel is the property of the Borough and is only to be used for commingle recycling collection. Damaged barrels must be returned to the Recycling Office so the serial number is removed from your address. There are no replacement barrels available at this time. Please mark your address on the barrel. Red decals to be placed on your own barrel will be issued in lieu of new barrels. If you wish your Borough barrel to be picked up at your house, call 201-794-5341 to schedule an appointment.

## Recycling Office – 201-794-5341



The Recycling Division office is located at the DPW complex at 20-05 Saddle River Road. The office is open Monday to Friday, 7 am to 3:15 pm.

### **Borough Holidays (Dates are as observed by Borough):**

New Year's Day (1/1), Martin Luther King Day (1/18), Lincoln's Birthday (2/13), President's Day (2/15), Good Friday (3/25), Easter Sunday (3/27), Memorial Day (5/30), Independence Day (7/4), Labor Day (9/5), Columbus Day (10/10), Veteran's Day (11/11), Thanksgiving (11/24 & 25), Christmas Day (12/25), Christmas Day Observed (12/26).

## Recycling Drop-Off Center

### **Restrictions:**

The drop off center is limited only to Fair Lawn residents and businesses. Proof of residency may be requested at any time.

### **Location:**

The Recycling Center is located at 20-05 Saddle River Road (DPW Complex). From Fair Lawn Avenue turn left onto Saddle River Road and the complex is located about a 1/2 mile on the right hand side.

### **Hours:**

Monday - Friday 7 am to 3:15 pm  
Saturday 9 am to 12:45 pm  
Sunday Noon to 3:45 pm  
(CLOSED all Borough Holidays and Easter Sunday)

### **Acceptable Materials:**

**All materials collected at curbside:** Any recyclable that may be placed at the curb for recycling may be brought to the center.



**Car Tires:** Any car, truck or bicycle tire is accepted as long as it is removed from the rim, though metal rims may be recycled with scrap metal. A small fee of \$1 per car tire and \$3 per truck tire is charged. No commercial establishments may dump tires at the center.

**Rechargeable Batteries:** Due to recent changes in the making of batteries, making them less hazardous, the Recycling Center will no longer accept regular household batteries. The Center will ONLY accept rechargeable batteries for recycling. Car batteries may be brought to a scrap metal yard or place of purchase for proper disposal.

**Used Clothing:** Clothing bins are available from several different organizations. Please have your materials contained in a plastic or paper bag and small enough to fit in the container opening. The Recycling office does NOT give receipts for donated items.

**Logs / Branches:** Any log, stump or branches that are too large for the curbside collection program may be brought to the Center in a private vehicle only. **No** commercial or rented vehicles will be permitted to dump any yard waste at the Center. If you have hired someone to do the work for you they should properly dispose of the yard waste for you, as part of the contracted work.

**NO CONTRACTOR, COMMERCIAL OR RENTED VEHICLES ARE ALLOWED  
TO DUMP YARD WASTE OR CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS  
NO EXCEPTIONS**

**Vehicles are permitted to drop yard waste once per week due to the number of landscapers coming in unmarked vehicles. If you or your vehicle looks like you could be a landscaper, expect to be prohibited from dumping. Employee decision is FINAL!**

# Garbage Collection

### Garbage Contractor:

The Borough is contracted with Cali Carting. All garbage complaints, including missed collections, should be directed to Cali Carting directly. Their phone number is 201-991-5400 or e-mail [info@calicarting.com](mailto:info@calicarting.com) (visit their website at [www.calicarting.com](http://www.calicarting.com)). Additional assistance may be provided through the Fair Lawn Recycling Division at 201-794-5341.

### Garbage Holidays:

The garbage contractor will not collect on the following holidays: New Years Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas. Consult the collection calendar for your section for the next garbage day.

### Container Requirements:

Garbage containers not only prevent animals from scavenging for food they also provide a means for the garbage collection personnel to carry and deposit your garbage into the collection truck. The following guidelines will help prevent litter as well as assist the garbage collection personnel in collecting more efficiently.

- ✓ Any metal or plastic barrel with a tight fitting lid that is not over 32 gallons in size. Pickle barrels are not acceptable or those with a lid opening smaller than the base of the can.
- ✓ Garbage containers may not weigh over 50 pounds. **(RGO 204.8(b))**
- ✓ No more than 4 containers or a total weight of 200 pounds may be put out for collection. Apartments buildings, businesses and houses of worship are limited to 500 pounds for any collection.
- ✓ *Cardboard boxes are prohibited from being used as a container and must be recycled as per regulations on page 2.*
- ✓ *The green Borough Recycling Barrel is prohibited from being used to hold garbage and may only be used for placement of bottles and can recycling materials.*
- ✓ **Loose plastic bags are not acceptable. Garbage must be placed in a sturdy container. (RGO 204.3)**



### Placement at Curb Regulations:

The following regulations must be adhered to when placing garbage at the curb for collection. Failure to do so may result in non-collection and/or a summons.

- ✓ Garbage or recycling may not be placed in the street. All items must be left between the curb and sidewalk. **(RGO 204-6)**
- ✓ Rugs, carpets and padding must be rolled and tied in 3 foot (or smaller) lengths. Limited to the 200 pound rule.
- ✓ Garbage may not be placed at the curb before **6 pm** the night before collection but **must be** at the curb by 5 am the morning of collection.

### Bulky Materials:

Fair Lawn does not require bulky materials to be set out on special days, but no more than one bulky item may be placed at the curb on each regular collection day. Bulky items include mattresses, box springs, dressers, furniture, etc. Do NOT break the item up or the contractor may think that it is construction material and refuse to collect it.

Remember that **metal items and electronics** such as appliances, bed frames, TVs, computers, etc. must be recycled. See the requirements for curbside recycling collection on page 2 for further details.

### Collection Times:

Collection routes are set by the contractor and may be changed at their discretion. All garbage must be placed at the curb for collection by **5 am** the day of collection. Any material placed at the curb later than this time risks not being collected.

Please refrain from calling if your garbage is not collected by its "normal" time. A number of things, including weather, truck breakdowns, road paving, etc., may occur that could detain the contractor from collecting the route and this could result in a delay in service. The contractor has until 6 PM to finish the route.

### Prohibited Materials:

The following items are not collected as part of the garbage collection:

- ✓ Construction material (including concrete) (it is the responsibility of the contractor or homeowner doing the work).
- ✓ Recyclables must be recycled as defined elsewhere in this booklet.
- ✓ Asbestos, paint, chemicals or other hazardous materials.
- ✓ Rocks, sod, dirt or yard waste.

## Construction Material

**Concrete, asphalt and brick must be recycled. Residents and contractors should turn in their recycling weight receipts to the Recycling Office so the Borough can earn recycling grant money!**

Construction material is the responsibility of the generator (homeowner, business, contractor). When doing construction on your home you have several options regarding its disposal. Regardless of the option that you choose for disposal, you are responsible to assure that it is done legally as outlined by all Federal, State and Borough laws.

Construction materials include building wood, paneling, sheet rock, tiles, toilets, sinks, wood doors, windows, cabinetry, countertops and garage doors. Construction does NOT include recyclables, hazardous materials, brick, block, stone, concrete, asphalt, stone, rocks, dirt, etc.

### **Option 1: Contractor Disposal:**

When you enter into a contract for a contractor to do renovations to your home or business, make provisions for the contractor to dispose of the materials.

### **Option 2: Hire a Sanitation Contractor:**

Many residents are now taking on "do-it-yourself" or DIY projects. Consider renting a dumpster from a sanitation company. Residents are reminded that a permit is required for placement in the street and is issued by the Department of Public Works (201) 794-5304.

### **Option 3: Bring the Material to a DEP Approved Transfer Facility:**

The facilities listed above are approved by NJ DEP for accepting solid waste and construction materials. Residents are advised to contact the facility to confirm that they will accept the waste, what costs are involved and what rules or regulations need to be followed when dumping at their facility. The residents are responsible for all costs.

### **Option 4: Bring it to the Fair Lawn Recycling Center for a Fee:**

The Fair Lawn Recycling Center will accept construction material from Fair Lawn residents in their private vehicles. Commercial and rented vehicles are prohibited from dumping construction material at the center. Residents are required to purchase vouchers at the Recycling Office prior to dumping construction at the center. **Vouchers are \$50 each. A passenger car requires one (1) voucher per trip, a trailer requires two (2) tickets per trip, an SUV, van or pick-up truck require three (3) vouchers per trip. Vouchers are non-refundable and expire after one year.**

Construction tickets are sold at the Recycling Office, open from 7:00 AM to 3:30 PM. The offices are closed on all Borough holidays. Employees at the Recycling Center do NOT sell the vouchers.

The Recycling Center is open to accept construction material, with proper vouchers, Monday to Friday from 7:00 AM to 3:15 PM, Saturdays from 9:00 AM to 12:45 PM and Sundays from Noon to 3:45 PM (The center is closed on all Borough holidays and Major holidays that fall on a weekend day such as Easter Sunday).

### **Option 5: Free Curbside Collection:**


As a courtesy to the residents, the Borough's garbage contractor will accept small amounts (4 barrels worth or 200 pounds) of construction material on garbage day twice per year during the designated weeks. Materials over the 4 barrel limit will not be collected. **The 2016 collections are during the weeks of May 2nd and October 17th.**
