

From 1947 to 1957, New York City baseball teams dominated the sport, winning 17 of 22 pennants and 9 of 11 World Series titles — including every World Series played from 1949 to 1956. Legends like Joe DiMaggio, Yogi Berra, Roy Campanella, Willie Mays, and Mickey Mantle captured 10 of the 18 MVP awards during this era. The Brooklyn Dodgers also made a groundbreaking move off the field by starting Jackie Robinson at first base in 1947. We'll explore these remarkable years before the Dodgers and Giants relocated to California.
